

## An Evening in Old Bethlehem

Bethlehem is the gift that keeps on giving. For 3 I years I have worked as a weaver in Old Bethlehem, two nights a week. ... That is a total of 62 times! I have worked with many dear friends in this congregation over the years, and they have played a huge supporting role. This year was special in that I was able to share that experience with a former student of mine, Tina Webber; who attends Abundant Life United Methodist Church.

Working in Bethlehem has always been a blessing to me. We have shown the blind what the craft of weaving is like. Last year a grown man cried as he watched us weaving because we reminded him of his mother in Mexico. Every year I work at Bethlehem I encounter wonders. It might be cold or rainy outside, but what happens inside the city warms your heart. I have two short blessings I would like to share with you that occurred this year. I talk to the children while I am preparing the weaving loom with additional yarn. A young teenage girl



who was waiting her turn to try the craft began a conversation with me. When I asked her if she had any friends with her, she said some of her classmates were behind her. Staying in character, I asked her, "Do you mean you go to school?"

When she replied yes, I informed her that I had never gotten to attend school because I was a girl. Alas, my future was then set to work in the city as a weaver most of my life because I had developed no other skills. The teenager became excited when she discovered girls could not attend school in Bethlehem, and turning to her friends she eagerly shared with her friends, "Did you hear that? Girls can't go to school in Bethlehem. I wish I was living then." That was the wrong thing to tell an educator of 45 years. Thinking quickly, I used that as a teaching moment. I told her the value of getting all the education she could possibly receive. I relayed the story of a boy in the village who attended the synagogue and later then became a rabbi. Her face suddenly got even more excited when I told her that. She then enthusiastically asked, "You mean they taught him how to be a rapper?" I said, "Well, not exactly, but he did go on to proclaim the good news.

Another blessing occurred when a young girl of about 4 or 5 came to my booth and said she had seen the baby not far from my shop. When I asked her what baby, she told me it was God's son. She said the baby was a boy and was named "Jee Sus." I inquired, "How I could find the baby in the crowd?" Excitedly, she said, "Just follow the star. An angel will help you." I then pointed out our Pastor Jerome in the tent city. I told her that he had come a long way just to find a miracle baby. He didn't know where to look for the baby because the baby wasn't in the inn. Would she please go show him the way? Suddenly, weaving wasn't her priority any more. She hurriedly grabbed her mom's hand, and said, "Come on." Off she went on her mission to tell Pastor Jerome where to find the baby. In just a few minutes, she had turned into one of God's ambassadors as she hurried over to spread the news. That is what Old Bethlehem is all about.

Mark 16:15 New Living Translation - "And then he told them," Go into all the world and preach the Good News to everyone." That is what Old Bethlehem does for our community and a charge for each of us to share in our own way. -Ellen Miller
